

REVIEWER INSTRUCTIONS

Thank you for agreeing to review an article for us. We are so grateful for your time and expertise.

The *IJCDS* aims to publish cutting-edge interdisciplinary social science research that sheds light on the intersections of structures of power with identity positions such as gender, race, sexuality and ability. We take a profoundly critical perspective on the question of diversity; that is, we are interested in activating a deep understanding of diversity as a tool for genuine social change. Our work is not about the performative diversification of existing structures, but rather emphasises radical insight into how power and privilege are made, sustained and undermined by difference. We emphasise an African and decolonial approach to global scholarship. When reviewing work submitted to us, please bear in mind this understanding of diversity.

We would appreciate it if you would consider the following questions/issues:

- Topic: Is this topic of the article relevant to our concerns? Will it be of interest to an international audience?
- Argument: Does the article make a convincing, novel and relevant argument?
- Literature: Does the article engage with an appropriate body of scholarly literature?
- Method: Please evaluate the methods/interpretations used by the authors. Do these align with the overall argument and are they used appropriately?
- Structure: Is the article well-structured? Do its arguments flow in a way that makes sense? Does it contain all the necessary elements of academic work?
- Writing: Is the writing clear and in an appropriate register?
- Accessibility: Has the article been produced with interdisciplinary readers in mind? Are concepts and context properly explained?

Ethics policy:

All research published in the *IJCDS* should take an ethical approach to fieldwork/ethnography, including institutional ethics reviews where necessary. Authors should approach their topics ethically, avoiding slurs, offensive language and negative stereotypes.

AI policy:

We do not support the use of AI in any way other than as a basic writing, grammar and spellcheck tool. AI should never be used to generate ideas, design structures, find literature or create arguments. As the technology does not currently exist to reliably detect AI usage, it is not possible to properly police this, but please flag to the editors if you are concerned that an article has misused AI.
